## PHASE 1: INPUT & ACQUISITION (1.5 HOURS)

Today introduces one of the most critical structural concepts in German: Noun Genders and Definite Articles. Complete:

- 1. **Episode 11: Arbeit und Beruf** (Introduction to stating what you do for a living).
- 2. **Episode 12: Was sind Sie von Beruf?** (Practicing the formal inquiries regarding jobs).
- 3. **Episode 13: Der Arbeitsplatz** (Vocabulary focus on workplaces and the introduction of der/die/das).

*Protocol:* Pay strict attention to how professions change based on whether a man or a woman is being discussed.

## PHASE 3: ACTIVE OUTPUT & GRAMMAR DRILLS (1.0 HOUR)

### Grammar Blueprint: Articles & Feminine Endings

#### 1. The Definite Articles (Nominative Case)

In German, "the" translates to three different words depending on the noun's grammatical gender:

- **der** (Masculine) - e.g., *der* Beruf, *der* Arzt
- **die** (Feminine) - e.g., *die* Klinik, *die* Frau
- **das** (Neuter) - e.g., *das* Krankenhaus, *das* Auto
- **die** (Plural) - All plural nouns use *die*, regardless of their original gender.

#### 2. Stating your Profession

Unlike English, you do **not** use an article when stating your job.

- *English*: I am **a** doctor.
- *German*: Ich bin Arzt. (I am doctor.) OR Ich arbeite **als** Arzt. (I work as doctor.)

#### 3. Feminine Profession Endings

To make a male profession female, generally add **-in** to the end. Some core words also add an Umlaut.

- der Informatiker → die Informatiker**in**
- der Arzt → die **Ärztin**
