Grammar Blueprint: Week 1 System Stress Test

The Rules of Engagement for Week 1:

If you can master these 4 rules, you have successfully completed the Week 1 architecture:

1. Verbs **MUST** sit in **Position 2** for statements and W-questions.
2. **sein** and **haben** are irregular and must be perfectly conjugated.
3. Nouns must match their definite (der/die/das) or indefinite (ein/eine) articles.
4. Negation of indefinite nouns uses **kein/keine**.
